s their peers neared retirement and began to downsize, Maria and Dale Disharoon decided to do the opposite. For 30 years, they lived in a condo in the La Jolla-University City neighborhood where they enjoyed the luxury of walking to work.

But the increased congestion and noise in the neighborhood ended up being too much. Their solution was to look for a detached home near the beach. What they didn't expect was to change their minds again, forgoing the beach, and instead, retiring in a 3,200-square-foot home on a quarter of an acre in east Oceanside by a golf course.
